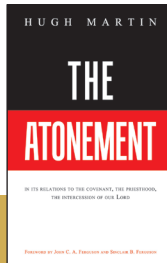
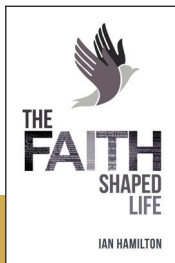
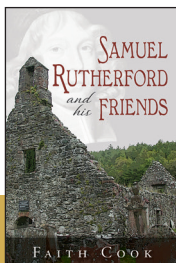

Refreshments

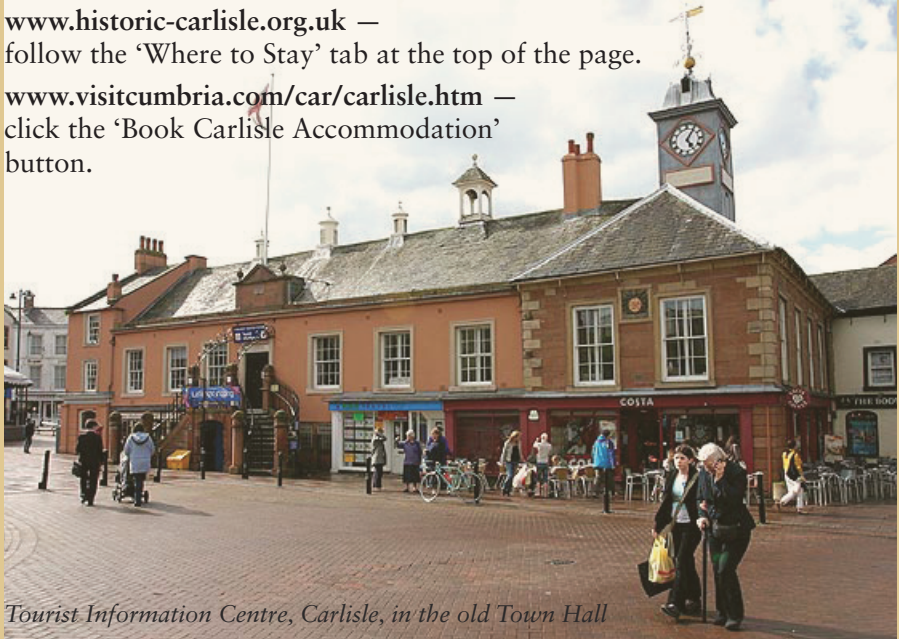
